Mark 12:18 27

¹⁸ Then *some* Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to Him; and they asked Him, saying: ¹⁹ "Teacher, Moses wrote to us that if a man's brother dies, and leaves *his* wife behind, and leaves no children, his brother should take his wife and raise up offspring for his brother. ²⁰ Now there were seven brothers. The first took a wife; and dying, he left no offspring. ²¹ And the second took her, and he died; nor did he leave any offspring. And the third likewise. ²² So the seven had her and left no offspring. Last of all the woman died also. ²³ Therefore, in the resurrection, when they rise, whose wife will she be? For all seven had her as wife."

²⁴ Jesus answered and said to them, "Are you not therefore mistaken, because you do not know the Scriptures nor the power of God? ²⁵ For when they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. ²⁶ But concerning the dead, that they rise, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the *burning* bush *passage*, how God spoke to him, saying, 'I *am* the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? ²⁷ He is not the God of the dead, but the God of the living. You are therefore greatly mistaken."

A question about the resurrection

- 1. Jesus is in the Temple teaching, preaching & healing
 - **a.** Who gave you this authority?
 - **b.** Should we pay taxes?
- 2. Another group called The Sadducees take a shot at our Lord
 - **a.** These were the aristocratic leaders in the Temple
 - i. They were few in number but very powerful
 - ii. They controlled the priesthood
 - 1. The high priest
 - 2. 24 chief priests
 - 3. 70 elders of Sanhedrin
 - iii. They had a good relationship with Rome

- iv. They controlled the buying and selling in the temple
 - 1. So they were angry with the temple cleansing
- v. They only believed in the Torah
- vi. They denied miracles, angels & the resurrection
- 3. They appeal to Jesus by saying "Teacher" (master)
 - a. Using flattery to get Jesus to let down His guard
- 4. They present Him with a problem from the scriptures knowing Jesus loves the Word of God
 - **a.** Moses said, if a man marries a woman and has no children...**Deut 25:5-6**
 - **b.** They formulated a puzzle for Him to solve hoping to embarrass Jesus
 - i. In the resurrection, who's wife will she be?
 - **c.** Their point was to prove the absurdity of the resurrection
- 5. They don't realize that they are fulfilling prophecy
 - a. They're carefully inspecting the lamb before Passover
 - **b.** They are scrutinizing every detail and He is absolutely perfect
- 6. Instead of ridiculing them about not believing in the resurrection
 - a. Jesus leads them back to God's Word and God's plan
 - **b.** Just as He did with the chief priests & scribes (**authority**)
 - **c.** Just as He did with the Herodians & Pharisees (**taxes**)
 - d. His heart is to bring truth to any and all who want to hear it
 - i. He used every opportunity to instruct people in God's way
 - ii. That should help us understand the heart of God better
 - 1. He is not angry waiting to strike

- 2. He's using every opportunity to bring us back to Himself with Truth and Grace
- 7. Jesus tells them they are mistaken because they did not know
 - a. The scriptures
 - b. The power of God
 - i. They didn't know the scriptures although they memorized every word
 - 1. They chose to only acknowledge the Torah
 - a. That is a dangerous thing when people choose which parts of the bible to believe
 - b. We are to take it all in because it's truth
 - c. **2 Tim 3:16** All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness;
 - d. **Psalm 119:160** The entirety of Your Word *is* truth, And every one of Your righteous judgments *endures* forever.
 - e. We're to read all of it & believe it all
 - 2. They learned the letters of the law and missed the meaning
 - a. They turned the scriptures into meaningless ceremony
 - i. God wants us to pray, we'll pray
 - ii. God wants us to fast, we'll fast
 - iii. God wants offerings, we'll bring them
 - 1. They performed the role but it didn't change their life
 - b. God warns them in Isaiah1:13
 - c. Do not bring any more meaningless offerings; I consider your incense detestable! You

observe new moon festivals, Sabbaths, and convocations, but I cannot tolerate sin-stained celebrations!

- d. Your relationship with God is supposed to transform you into His image
 - i. If I'm not changing, something is wrong
 - ii. If I'm not growing in grace, in knowledge, in character, then I don't have the real thing
- e. The letter kills, but the spirit gives life (2 Cor 3:6)

8. It's important to be students of scripture

- **a. 2 Tim 2:15** Study to show yourself approved unto God, a workman that needs not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.
- **b. Psalm 119:9** How can a young man keep his way pure? By keeping it according to Your word.

i. They were ignorant of the power of God

- 9. They rejected the idea of miracles
 - 1. God who placed the stars in their place
 - 2. Who created man & breathed into him
 - 3. Who plagued the Egyptians and saved the Israelites
 - 4. Who fed them with manna and water from the rock
 - 5. Gave them a pillar of fire by night...
 - a. It may be because that's what the elite group believes
 - b. If you want to be "in", that's what you believe
 - c. Inability to think for yourself and see truth is called a cult.

10. They only lived by their senses

- i. It's impossible to live your Christian life with the 5 senses & without faith
- ii. Faith is believing what the senses cannot attain
 - I think many times, I can also live by my senses Relying on what I see and feel
 - a. forgetting the element of faith
- **b.** Having a good foundation in the scriptures is critical in teaching us to live by faith
 - i. That's why we go through the gospels
 - 1. To learn God's truth
 - 2. To be reminded
 - 3. To build faith
- 11. Vs. 25 For when they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven
 - **a.** Your new nature in heaven will be glorified
 - i. No more pain
 - ii. No more sickness
 - iii. No more separation
 - iv. No more suffering or death
 - **b.** We don't know what that looks like but it will be glorious like the angels in heaven
 - c. Vs. 26 But concerning the dead, that they rise, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the *burning* bush *passage*, how God spoke to him, saying, 'I *am* the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? ²⁷ He is not the God of the dead, but the God of the living. You are therefore greatly mistaken."
 - **d.** Jesus uses Exodus to prove the resurrection
 - e. I AM the God of Abraham...
 - i. **I AM** the God of the living, not the dead

- ii. Abraham is more alive now than ever
- iii. Isaac is more alive now...
- iv. He's using what they believe to help them realize
 - 1. The human soul will live forever
 - 2. Please consider your life today because it has consequences
 - 3. You will live forever someplace
- **f.** The word mistaken here suggests that they are "leading themselves astray"
 - i. They chose to believe what was convenient for them
- **g.** The truth stood right in front of them and they ended up in hell
- h. Many hear the truth weekly and will end up in a dark place
- 12. To the believer, rejoice, this world is not our home
 - **a.** There is a city built by God for us
- 13. To those not sure, today is the day of salvation
 - i. Let's acknowledge the truth together
