Luke 2 pt 3

Luke 2: 21-38

And when eight days were completed for the circumcision of the Child, His name was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb.

- ²² Now when the days of her purification according to the law of Moses were completed, they brought Him to Jerusalem to present *Him* to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every male who opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord"), ²⁴ and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the law of the Lord, "A pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons."
- ²⁵ And behold, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name *was* Simeon, and this man *was* just and devout, waiting for the Consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶ And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. ²⁷ So he came by the Spirit into the temple. And when the parents brought in the Child Jesus, to do for Him according to the custom of the law, ²⁸ he took Him up in his arms and blessed God and said:
- ²⁹ "Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, According to Your word;
- ³⁰ For my eyes have seen Your salvation
- 31 Which You have prepared before the face of all peoples,
- ³² A light to *bring* revelation to the Gentiles, And the glory of Your people Israel."
- ³³ And Joseph and His mother marveled at those things which were spoken of Him. ³⁴ Then Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary His mother, "Behold, this *Child* is destined for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign which will be spoken against ³⁵ (yes, a sword will pierce through your own soul also), that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

- ³⁶ Now there was one, Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, and had lived with a husband seven years from her virginity; ³⁷ and this woman *was* a widow of about eighty-four years, who did not depart from the temple, but served *God* with fastings and prayers night and day. ³⁸ And coming in that instant she gave thanks to the Lord, and spoke of Him to all those who looked for redemption in Jerusalem.
 - 1. This is the famous Christmas story of the birth of Jesus
 - I. Shepherds, Shekinah, Savior
 - I. A visit to the Temple
 - 1. Luke takes time to explain the details & specifics of Christ's birth
 - a. Before His birth, O.T prophets declared that the Messiah would arrive at a set time
 - b. During His birth, those who witnessed the Messiah first hand gave collaborating testimony
 - c. Shortly after His birth, secular historians confirm the same
 - i. It's important that we're not speaking of a thought, a concept, an idea or a movement...

- ii. We are speaking of a real person who was born in a humble Jewish family
- 2. Jesus was circumcised on the 8th day fulfilling the law
 - a. Circumcision predated the law of Moses
 - i. God gave it to Abraham Gen 17
 - b. On the 8th day according to **Leviticus 12:2-3**
 - This was a covenant between Abraham and his seed and God forever
 - ii. It was an outward demonstration of an inward truth
 - iii. The cutting away of the foreskin. A deliberate, intentional sanctification, cleansing
 - c. This is important to note for us & understand because
 - i. After spiritual birth, comes spiritual circumcision
 - ii. The cutting away and being forever identified with God
 - iii. Just like when Joshua had the people circumcised at Gilgal
 - It was a voluntary and intentional choice to be made

- iv. It's declaring before God, I don't want the works of the flesh...
- v. I want to live a holy and pure life
 - 1. It's a spiritual thing for us today
 - 2. Jesus said, if anyone wants to follow me, he must take up his cross daily and follow me
- d. This act of circumcision also depicts the stages of the spiritual life
- e. As one author also put it
 - i. The stages of the life of Christ, including the circumcision are the same stages that a believer will follow if they're to live like Christ
 - 1. We're born again
 - 2. [Circumcision were]We decide to live for God and put off the works of the flesh
 - 3. The epiphany of who we are children of God
 - 4. Our baptism public confirmation of our association with Christ
 - 5. A time of temptation where our faith is tested
 - 6. Begin active ministry

- 7. Carry the cross of Jesus and die with Him
- 8. Rise in the glorious Resurrection (**Biblical** illustrator)
- 9. This then ought to be the real mirror that we use
- 10. Not how do I feel or what do others think
 - a. Allow the mirror of God's Word to show you where you stand
- f. These 8 steps in the life of a believer mark a new beginning
 - i. 8 is the number of new beginnings
 - ii. Jesus is circumcised on the 8th day
- 3. He was given the name Jesus just as the angel spoke
 - a. Savior
 - i. Joshua in Hebrew
 - ii. Jesus in the Greek
 - 1. The visual is detailed and specific
 - 2. Joshua brought the children of Israel into the promised land as Moses was unable to

- 3. The law cannot bring you into a right relationship not because it's lacking, but because we are lacking
- 4. Joshua (God is my salvation) was able to conquer the 7 kings of Canaan and give Israel her inheritance
- b. Our savior Jesus is the one who will bring His children into the promised land of abundant living
- 4. Some believe the child is named when circumcised because Abram's name was changed the day he was circumcised
- 5. He didn't need to be circumcised because of any sin... He is sinless
 - a. His relationship to the law is very important as He came to fulfill the law
- 6. Everything the law required, Jesus was the only one able to complete

7. Wiersbe:

- a. He was [born] under the law Gal 4:4
- b. He obeyed God's law perfectly John 8:46
- c. He bore the curse of the law for us Gal 3:13
- d. He set us free from bondage Gal 5:1
- 8. Jesus didn't take any shortcuts
 - a. Whatever the law required, He was able to perform

- 9. One of the things that the law required was an offering when presenting the child at the Temple
 - a. Joseph & Mary brought turtledoves as they couldn't afford a lamb
 - b. He was born into a poor family to be able to associate with the poor
 - c. He wanted to walk in the shoes of the impoverished and remove the stigma of the poor
 - i. That somehow they are forgotten by God
 - 1. God loves and cares for all of His children
 - e. Although they couldn't afford a lamb, they had The Lamb
- 10. An unexpected and welcomed surprise to Joseph & Mary
- 11. It's been over a month since His birth and perhaps they feel a bit alone
 - a. All of their immediate family is in Nazareth
 - b. They've been in Judah now for some time
 - c. Perhaps they need a reminder or some encouragement regarding God's promises

d. God does not leave Himself without a witness

e. **Acts 14:17** Nevertheless he left not himself without witness, in that he did good, and gave us rain from heaven, and fruitful seasons, filling our hearts with food and gladness.

12. 2 separate believers meet with them in the Temple

- a. They're about to give Mary and Joseph a double confirmation
- 13. Simeon and Anna witnessed to the glory of Jesus as a baby
- 14. God has a remnant of faithful believers made up of the old, the young, from both Judea the beloved and Nazareth the insignificant
 - a. His graces extends out to include the outcasts of Shepherds
- 15. Simeon is a God fearing man
 - a. (Hearkening, listening)
 - Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word;
 - c. Simeon was a man who was filled with the Holy Spirit
 - i. The Holy Spirit was upon him
 - ii. It has been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit

- iii. So he came by the Spirit into the temple
 - 1. This indicated that he walked in intimacy with God
 - 2. He wanted God and was yielded to Him
 - 3. The level of intimacy that we have with God is our choice
- d. God shows him that now is the time to see the Messiah before you die
- e. He says now my eyes have seen your salvation
- f. Imagine how many babies are brought to the temple to fulfill the law. By the Holy Spirit, Simeon knows this is The Baby, the savior
- g. My eyes have seen your salvation
 - i. Salvation is not a prayer we say or something we do
 - 1. Salvation is a person
 - a. Help me see you Lord
 - ii. "He (Jesus) is a light to bring revelation to the gentiles"
 - 2. Jews hated gentiles
 - 3. He wasn't speaking his own words, this was a Word from the Lord
 - iii. And the glory of Your people Israel

- 4. the glory means God wants to dwell with His people
- h. Jesus is not just for the Jews, but for all people (gentiles)
- i. That's the way God intended it from the beginning
- j. Israel would be a light to the nations and come to faith
- k. Since Israel failed to fulfill their destiny, God will Himself be a revelation to the Gentiles and the Glory of His people Israel

16. My eyes have seen Your Salvation

- a. It wasn't the natural eye that he saw with
- b. I've often prayed to see God with my natural eyes
- c. Many saw Jesus and never believed
 - i. Lord, give us eyes of faith to see you with
- 17. Behold, this *Child* is destined for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign which will be spoken against ³⁵ (yes, a sword will pierce through your own soul also), that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."
 - d. His presence will turn the order of things on its head
 - i. The religious will be challenged and rebuked
 - ii. The elite will be exposed

- iii. The outcasts will be welcomed
- iv. The forgotten will be embraced
- v. A sword will pierce your heart Mary as you watch your young Son persecuted, accused, beaten and nailed to a tree
- e. What a breath of fresh air this believer was for Mary & Joseph
- 18. Immediately, we're introduced to Anna
 - a. An older believer who served God with fasting and prayer
 - b. (451) Anna Grace
 - c. (5323) Phanuel The face of God (presence of God)
 - d. (768) Asher Happy, blessed
- 19. Luke is drawing a picture for Theophilus
 - a. In the middle of the unsolicited confirmation, God wants to communicate His truth
 - b. The blessed happy (smiling) Face (presence of God) is extending Grace
 - c. God is rejoicing at this intervention
 - vi. You may have thought this to be an inconvenience for God

- vii. To dwell among people
- viii. To die a horrible death for our salvation
 - ix. Just ask any loving parent who sees their child drowning if it's an inconvenience to save them, despite your favorite suit or dress
- 20. You are to rejoice and be filled with the same comfort that both Simeon and Anna are filled with
 - a. The consolation of Israel and the world is here
 - b. The desire of all nations is among you
 - c. He is extending Gracing coming from His rejoicing blessed presence
- 21. Anna goes and tells everyone she meets
- 22. One can't help but speak of the one they love
- 23. If I'm not speaking of Him much to others, my prayer should be
 - a. Lord, open my eyes to see your salvation
 - i. You are a light to those in darkness
 - ii. You are the glory that surrounds your people
