Luke 7 pt 1 vs. 01-10

Now when He concluded all His sayings in the hearing of the people, He entered Capernaum. ² And a certain centurion's servant, who was dear to him, was sick and ready to die. ³ So when he heard about Jesus, he sent elders of the Jews to Him, pleading with Him to come and heal his servant. ⁴ And when they came to Jesus, they begged Him earnestly, saying that the one for whom He should do this was deserving, ⁵ "for he loves our nation, and has built us a synagogue."

⁶ Then Jesus went with them. And when He was already not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to Him, saying to Him, "Lord, do not trouble Yourself, for I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof. ⁷ Therefore I did not even think myself worthy to come to You. But say the word, and my servant will be healed. ⁸ For I also am a man placed under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does *it.*"

⁹ When Jesus heard these things, He marveled at him, and turned around and said to the crowd that followed Him, "I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel!" ¹⁰ And those who were sent, returning to the house, found the servant well who had been sick

- 3. 4 diff people with diff needs,
- 4. Jesus is now showing us not just great teaching, but a heart of compassion
- 5. There is a link between these 4 stories and the 4 "beatitudes" of Ch. 6
 - a. In these 4 examples, we'll see how:
 - 1. The poor in spirit are blessed The Centurion

- 2. Those who are hungry now are blessed the Widow
- 3. Those who weep now shall rejoice John the Baptist
- 4. You are blessed when you are hated and excluded Sinful woman

I. Warrior

- 1. After Jesus finished His sayings in the hearing of the people, He entered Capernaum (Village of Nahum)
- 2. A certain centurion had a servant who was sick
 - a. A centurion is a military leader who has 80-100 soldiers under him
- 3. 4 times centurions are mentioned and always in a good light
 - a. One centurion at the Cross: "Truly this was the son of God" (Matthew 27:54)
 - b. Cornelius was a devout man who prayed, fasted... (Acts 10)
 - c. Julius helped Paul and showed him favor (Acts 27)
 - d. This centurion recorded in Matthew 8 and Luke 7
- 4. There was lots of interaction between the roman soldiers and the Jewish people.
 - a. It was favorable for Rome to have religion. It kept the peace
- 5. So centurions were very familiar with the Jewish culture
- 6. He's a Gentile who clearly loves the Jewish people
 - a. He's a wealthy & generous man who built a synagogue

- 1. Paid up to 17 times more than a legionary soldier
- 7. He has a slave who is about to die and he cares for that slave
 - a. The normal thing to do was simply let him die
 - b. It is unusual for a master to be so kind toward a slave.
- 8. When his servant was sick, the centurion asked the elders of the Jews to beg Jesus to heal him.
 - a. This was a unique position for the elders of the Jews to be in.
 - 1. They did not believe in Jesus, but their friendship with the centurion forced them
- 9. They said that the centurion was worthy
 - a. That is religions view / People's normal view of how things work with God
 - 1. Religion says, here is what a good deserving person looks like,
 - 2. Humble, loving, generous & giving...
 - b. As if people have it within them to be good on their own
 - 1. "Those who are good have an audience with God"
 - c. Religion believes that the better you are, the more you behave, the more God is likely to answer your prayers
 - d. The truth is none of us will ever be good enough to earn anything with God
 - e. All the good we receive is by His Grace
- 10. Today in the church, we can easily fall into that same trap

- a. If I behave myself, I'll have God's attention
- b. If I do well, God will owe me in answering my prayer
- c. If I pray, serve, give... God will owe me.
- d. Nothing could be further from the truth
- e. God will never owe anyone anything
- f. God's goodness on us is because of His Grace
- 11. **Vs. 6** Jesus went with them
 - a. He would have healed the servant simply at his request
 - b. We've seen Jesus heal all kinds of people
 - 1. I.E. the man who didn't really believe & neither did the disciples

II. Word

- 1. Speak a word and my servant will be healed
- 2. What is remarkable in this story is that this man had an understanding greater than most Jews in Israel
 - a. As he considered the matter, he said, wait, go tell Jesus, I'm not worthy for you to enter my home... Just say the Word...
 - b. Just speak a word and my servant will be healed
- 3. Jesus marveled
 - a. How is it that a gentile understands more than the people of Israel?

- 4. His eyes were opened to the fact that Jesus has authority
 - a. That when a Word is given, it must be obeyed
- 5. What is astounding is that this man had humility, love, faith
 - a. His humility said, I'm not worthy for you to enter my home...
 - 1. He has the correct view of a relationship with God
 - 2. God doesn't owe us anything
 - 3. He's poor in spirit
 - b. His love for his servant caused him to search for Jesus
 - 1. Most slave owners simply will buy another slave
 - 2. They're tools to be replaced, not people to be loves
 - c. His faith in Jesus led him to say, just speak a word...

6. He understood something

- a. I speak in Caesar's name, You speak in God's name
- b. When I speak in Caesar's name, fear is the motivation
- c. When Jesus speaks, He doesn't use fear, His Words are powerful & creative
- 7. Considering the life of Jesus, every word that He spoke has authority
 - a. Every blind person He dealt with is able to see
 - b. Every leper is who prayed for a healing was completely cleansed
 - c. Every lame person the Master encountered is able to walk
 - d. Every demonized person Jesus met with is delivered
 - 1. Jesus is clearly walking in the authority of God and His Word is powerful

- 8. Speak a word and my servant will be healed
- 9. Where would such a man get this information and level of faith?

a. We presume

- 1. God is always at work and doesn't discriminate between Jew / gentile
- 2. Copies of the O.T writings were readily available in the common language
- 3. Grace must have touched his life
- b. Where else would someone find faith, hope and love?
- c. It can only be found in the Word of God that brings light into darkness
- d. Perhaps it was the following verses that he considered
- 10. Psalm 138:2 I bow down toward your holy temple and give thanks to your name for your steadfast love and your faithfulness; for you have exalted your name and your word above everything
- 11. **Psalm 33:9** For He spoke, and it was *done;* He commanded, and it stood fast
- 12. **Psalm 107:20** He sent His word and healed them, And delivered them from their destructions
- 13. How God dealt with the nation of Israel in the wilderness
- 14. God spoke promises to people and they all came to pass
 - a. When He spoke to Abraham, He gave him a son
 - b. When God spoke to Joseph in dreams, God brought it to pass
 - c. When God spoke to David about being king, God made it happen
 - d. When God told Israel to repent or judgment is coming, it happened

- e. When God was ready to restore Israel, He brought them back home
 - 1. God's Word is powerful
 - 2. Jesus is walking in that power
 - 1. "Your word Lord is enough for me"
- 15. I appreciate that in taking in God's word, he didn't use it to name and claim better things for himself
 - a. In looking at his helpless servant, he pleaded for the life of another
 - b. How do we know when the grace of God touches our hearts?
 - 1. When we look away from ourselves and plead for others
 - c. But what about my needs?
 - d. My God shall supply all of your needs according to his riches in glory
- 16. I think what will bring the glory of God among us is not to look to ourselves but to begin to cry out to Jesus: Speak a Word and my ... will be healed
 - a. My Son / Daughter
 - b. My relatives
 - c. My neighbors
 - d. My community
- 17. Just speak a Word...
- 18. That's all it will take
 - a. Talitha Cumi
 - b. Lazarus, come forth
